LAND IQ CROP DEMAND PROPOSAL

Manager Mills reviewed the proposal for 2019-2020 and 2020-20201 water year services from Land IQ that was also discussed at a previous meeting. SGM IMPLEMENTATION GRANT PROJECT

Manager Mills reported that the Tulare Lake GSAs had agreed to pursue a SGM Round 1 Implementation Grant from DWR. He explained that the District's Griswold Basin project appeared to be a good match for the funding opportunity. He presented to the Board two conceptual designs for the facility, depending on available grant funds. He also conveyed that it was likely that a 25% cost share would be required, given the current understanding of who would qualify for a cost share waiver. The projects that were also being considered by other GSA areas were also briefly discussed. Manager Mills recommended that the District be willing to pursue the Griswold

Basin project through an SGM Round 1 Implementation Grant, pay for a portion of the grant app development, and commit to a local cost share if necessary. Director Freitas made that motion and Director Murray seconded it. President Taylor called for a vote and the vote for all of the Directors was as follows:

HSR – RIVERSIDE & OLD RIVER PLANS

Manager Mills reported on recent meetings and communications with California High Speed Rail Authority representatives on the proposed plan sets for Riverside Culvert, work adjacent to Dam 5 in the Old Kings River Channel and the Batti Basin culvert. Manager Mills relayed that CHSRA was requesting approval of the design plans and that he recommended that the District approve the proposed plan sets for the Riverside Culvert and authorize him to sign the plans on behalf of the District.
